Dear praying friends and supporters;

Our main work here in Honduras is to preach, witness, and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I have been excited about the many opportunities that we have had these two months to do just that. Many times, the WORK here hinders us from being able to go and share. Most of the time we are 85% work and 15% evangelizing. Sometimes we are able to do both at the same time, other times the work being done is a means to get an opportunity to share the Gospel.

Our cross-country trip with the two young men fell into the 85 -15% category. When their flights got in, we loaded up in a taxi and rode till nighttime, then got a hotel room. The next day we were till around noon before we got to the next hotel where we would be picked up around 3:00 am the next morning by two small trucks. A five-hour ride to the river gave us a chance to witness some to the driver as much as he was willing to receive it. Then it was just sit and ride for another 5 or 6 hours on the river till we got to the village of Pansana. The two other men in our group were coming from Puerto Lempira on the 4-wheeler with a trailer. What was expected to be a 4 or 5-hour trip turned into a 2-day nightmare for them, trying to get through the mud and losing the right trail. Thankfully the Lord protected them, and they made it to Pansana on the third morning. Our first day there we cleaned the house and yard, then in the afternoon went out and visited every house in the village inviting folks to Sunday service and revival through Wednesday, as well as the kids to a Bible Club on Saturday. There were 20+ kids that came for the Bible Club! We had a great time with two Bible lessons, coloring, snack, and some games. Our church services were not well attended, but we thank the Lord for the five people that did come and hear the Gospel.

The trip home on Thursday was extremely difficult. Not so much as it was for the two men by themselves. With five of us pushing the 4-wheeler through the mud, creeks, and rivers, it only took us 16 hours to get to Puerto Lempira, and then another 3 hours to get over to the house from there. Not much witnessing going on that day other than handing out tracts in villages that we passed through. We thank the Lord for safety, and good opportunities to give the Gospel to folks. We really appreciate Bro. Nathan Eaton, Clint Rodgers, Alex Cruz, and Pastor Andy Robles making the trip happen.

For the next couple of weeks our work consisted of installing solar panels at Pastor Andy's house in Puerto Lempira, welding three water pumps for wells that we would be drilling in the next couple of months and drilling a well in the village of Tikuabila/Sruhi. Bro. Alex Cruz from San Buena Ventura, Honduras was with us for a 7-week internship from February till the last of March. He was a great blessing and help in the work and the ministry. He was able to preach several times, teach a teen Sunday school class, as well as teach a class on Romans to one of our young men here. In the middle of



his internship, Bro Clint Rogers from New Mexico came to be with us for 6 weeks. Not speaking Spanish, we were able to translate for him when he did some of his illusion tricks for the kids. He did great getting to know a lot of the boys and playing with them, as well as tagging along with me everywhere I went. He had some long days and some hard work without complaint. We pray the Lord will direct him in His will as he grows and matures.

This year for Semana Santa (Holy Week), we held services Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. In the morning we had service at our Miskito church here by the house, with just a couple coming on Wednesday but by Friday we had a really good crowd. In the evenings we held services in the Spanish church and had an average of 5 come.

The last three weeks of April I have been resting from trips, doing maintenance on equipment and the physical plant around the house, as well as digging out a path across the swamp with the tractor for our neighbor behind us. Of the trees we dug up only one has been a real bugger. With my chainsaw not running right we have had to use the machete and the pickaxe.

We have begun teaching classes on Wednesday evenings in the Spanish church. So far, we have done two weeks with a man and two children the first week, and this last week with three men. We are studying though the book of Romans verse by verse with no exams nor set time. The goal is to eventually start having services there on Wednesday evenings.

We have three big events coming up in the next three months. First April 14th – 17th we will be having a Bible Revival in the village of Prumitara on the far northwest point of our “Island” or peninsula. Probably a village of 1000 or more people. Our goal is to give out 400 Bibles to people who come to the evening services. Transportation is by boat and we will be going there in the afternoons and coming back at night after church. The second event is planned for the last of June to head upriver. We have been able to have local people clean the properties while we are not there, so we are hoping to be able to spend more time evangelizing and preaching.

In July we are hoping to be able to take our three pastors to a “Pastor’s Conference” in the interior of Honduras at “Bethlehem Baptist Church” in Danli. It is going to cost \$500.00 per round trip ticket to do this. I also wanted to get them a new set of clothes and shoes for the meeting, along with at least two special dining events. (Burger King, and a regular restaurant) With motel nights included I think we can do this for around \$700.00 each. Thank you for your continued prayers for us as we seek to serve the Lord in His work here in the region of La Moskitia Honduras.
